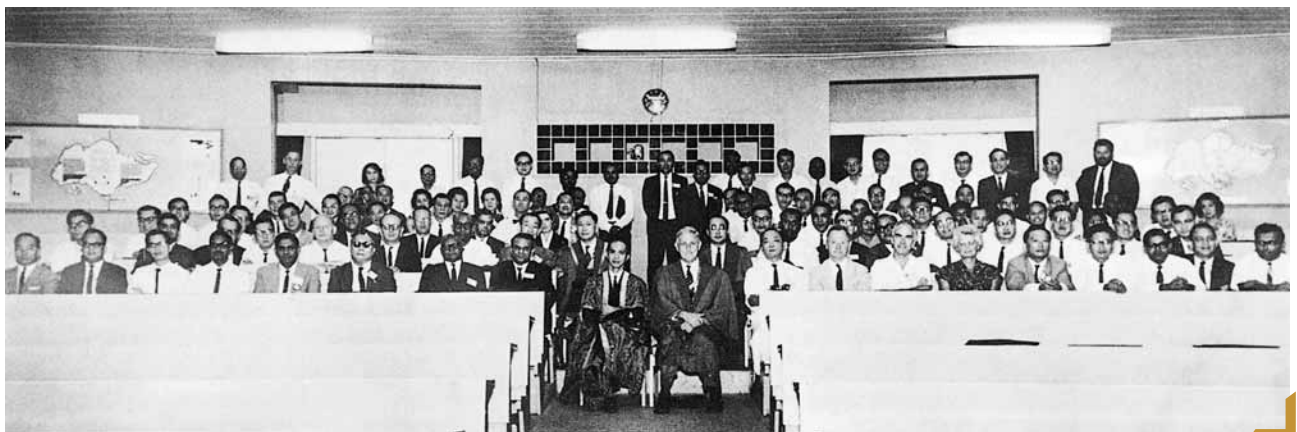
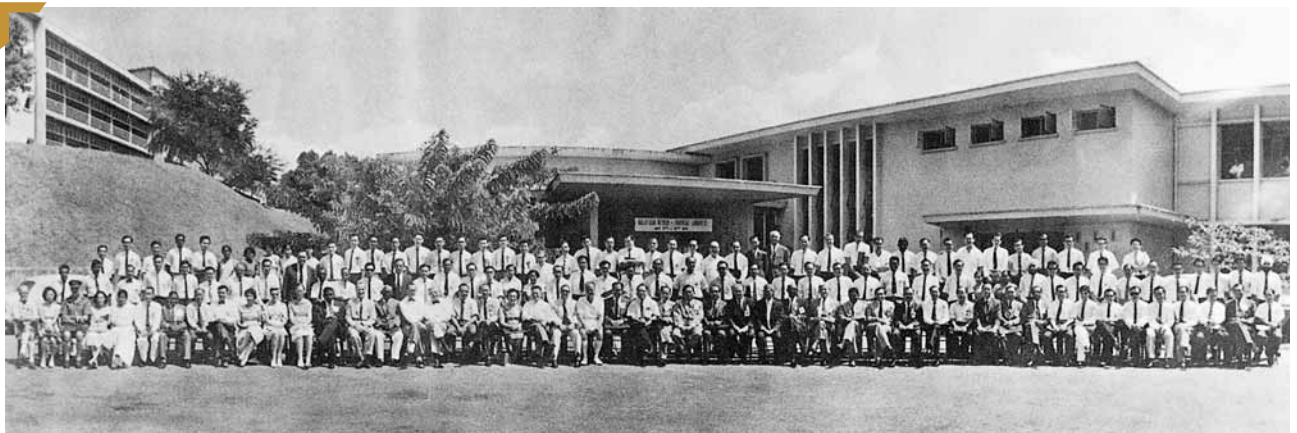

1963

The 1st Congress of Medicine was held at the Pathology Lecture Theatre in the grounds of the Singapore General Hospital from 3-5 May 1963. The President of the 1st Congress was Sir Gordon Ransome. The Congress was declared open by Dr K Shanmugaratnam, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Malaya in Singapore.



1965

The 2nd Congress of Medicine was held in the Pathology Lecture Theatre under the Presidency of Dr H M McGladdery, formerly Senior Surgeon at Singapore General Hospital and then later at Lady Templar Hospital in Kuala Lumpur, Malaya. The Congress was held from 28-29 August 1965. It was declared open by Mr Reginald Quah, Deputy Vice-Chancellor, University of Singapore.

ACADEMY OF MEDICINE GETS COAT OF ARMS

THE work of specialists and consultants in the field of medicine in this part of the world was honoured today by Queen Elizabeth.

In a simple 15-minute ceremony, the Yang di-Pertuan Negara, Inche Yusof bin Ishak, presented the letters patent for the coat-of-arms to the Academy of Medicine at Singapore.

The letters patent—an impressive handwritten scroll with the colourful seals of three officials of the College of Arms in London—was handed over to

the Master of the Academy, Dr. Gwee Ah Leng, in a red box.

The presentation was made at the Alumni Association Medical Centre in College Road. Later, Inche Yusof unveiled the coat-of-arms.

KEY WORD

Professor J. A. Jansen, Bedel of the Academy, said the word "at" in the title was because the Academy "must be open to all worthy

members of the medical profession—particularly in those areas who share with us many things in common—the Malaysian States."

The word signified that while the Academy held meetings in Singapore, its sphere of influence should not be limited to within its confines.

Membership to the Academy is by invitation and is confined to specialists or consultants in the medical sciences who by their conduct and practice have shown themselves worthy to become members.

There are now 100 members.

COAT OF ARMS FOR S'PORE ACADEMY OF MEDICINE

SINGAPORE, Sat — In a colourful ceremony the Yang di-Pertuan Negara, Inche Yusof bin Ishak, presented the master of the Singapore Academy of Medicine with the letters patent for a coat of arms.

The presentation ceremony before doctors, specialists and professors draped in academic robes took place at the Alumni Association Medical Centre in College Road.

The Head of the State and his consort, Puan Noor Aisha, were met on arrival by the Master and Council of the Academy.

After being introduced to members of the council, the Head of State and his consort were led to the rostrum.

Inche Yusof presented the letters patent for a coat of arms to Dr. Gwee Ah Leng, master of the academy, soon after an address by Professor J. A. Jansen, Bedel of the academy.

Dr. Gwee then invited Inche Yusof unveiled the Coat of

Arms. This was done amidst another burst of hand-claps.

In the coat of arms was a central shield the chevron — which symbolised the coming together of the specialties of medicine under one roof — the Academy.

The Malaysian territories were represented by three leopards. The twin-headed eagles surmounting the crest were a reminder that the academy were privileged to use their first crest — the family arms of the first master of the academy Professor Gordon Ransome.

The common source of desire to overcome pain was explained by the poppy flowers in the coat of arms.

Inche Yusof and Puan Noor Aisha were later entertained at a buffet tea.

ARMORIAL BEARINGS

The Armorial Bearings of the Academy of Medicine were designed by the Pursuivant of Arms at the College of Arms, London and were granted by the Sovereign's Kings of Arms (Garter, Clarenceux and Norroy and Ulster) on 20 June 1962.

The Coat of Arms is as follows: "Per pale and per chevron Gules and Azure a Chevron cotised between three Leopards' faces Or and for the Crest On a Wreath, Or, Gules and Azure Two Eagles' heads addorsed Azure beaked Or and gorged with a chaplet of Roses - Gules barbed and seeded in each beak a Poppy slipped and leaved proper".

In the centre of the Shield, the Chevron symbolises the coming-together of the Specialties of Medicine under one roof - the Academy. The three Pards represent the territories in the Singapore-Malaysia region. The two Eagles' heads of the Crest remind us of the privilege we had of using the family Arms of our first Master, Gordon Ransome, in the early years of our existence. The Poppies denote our common desire to relieve pain. The Motto RECTA SAPERE urges us to seek and savour the truth at all times.

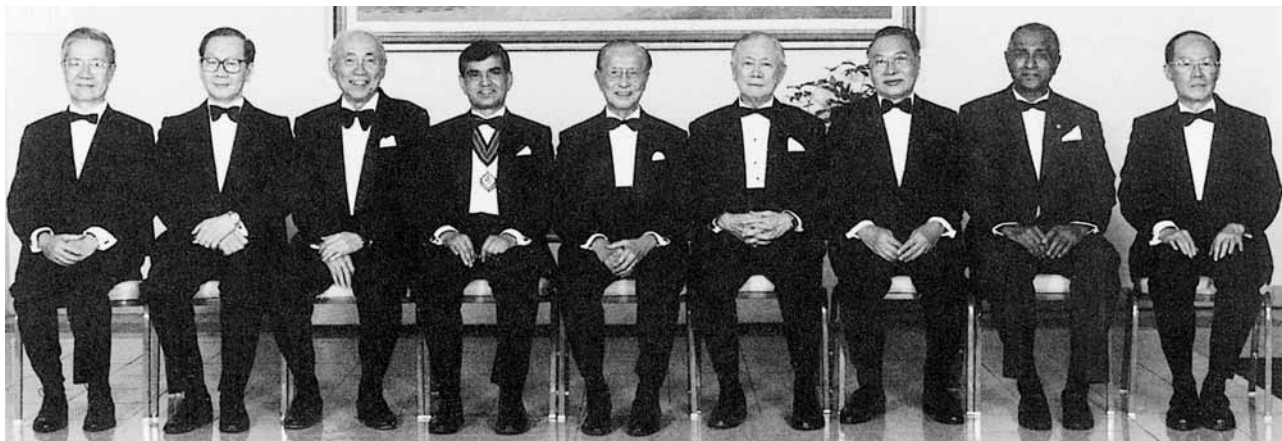

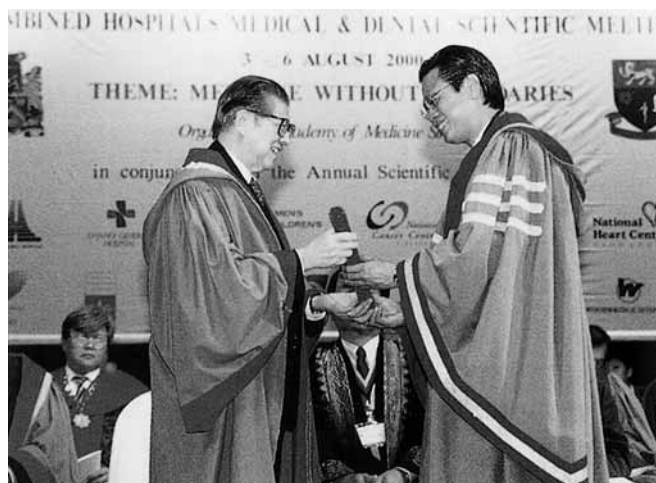

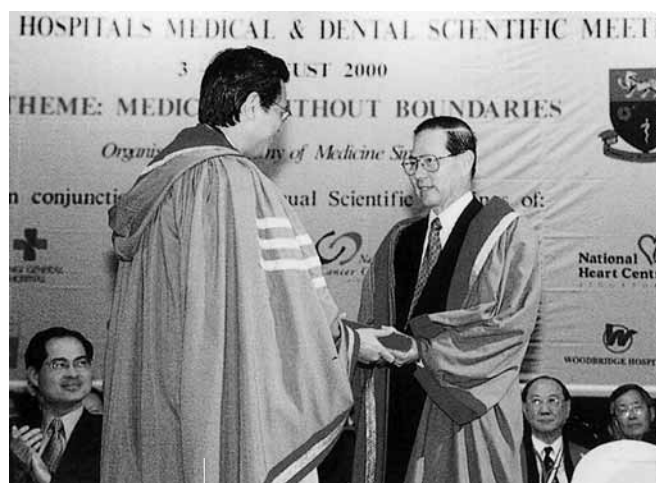
